take a picnic to a picturesque field to do some oil painting is morphed into a Wild West-style shoot-out with a drunk clown, who pulls a gun on them for no reason. "A brilliant mix and beautifully done," Isherwood says. "You know it's set up, but you don't know what for. The minute you see the clown, though, you go 'uh oh'."

The director attended the New York
Film Academy in 1998, and after
leaving Edinburgh University, he
assisted directors such as Alfonso
Cuarón on Harry Potter and the
Prisoner of Azkaban and Tim Burton on
Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.

In 2005, he co-founded the production company Between The Eyes. His commercial directing work includes spots for Mini, Foster's and *The Sun*, and he was the executive producer on the feature *Extraordinary Rendition*.
